Dr. Leslie Ettre was a senior scientist with Perkin-Elmer, Shelton, Connecticut, for 30 years, until his retirement in 1990. Between 1988 and 1995, he served as adjunct professor in the Department of Chemical Engineering at Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut, and from 1995 to 2004 continued his association with the school as a research affiliate.

In addition to lecturing widely in the field of gas chromatography, Dr. Ettre has published over 200 scientific and technical papers and is the author of numerous books, including the *Encyclopedia of Industrial Chemical Analysis*. He has received numerous awards, including the National Award in Chromatography of the American Chemical Society and the AJP Martin Award of the Chromatographic Society – the highest honors in the United States and Europe, respectively. He was also the first recipient of the Palmer Award in 1980, awarded by the Minnesota Chromatography Forum.

Dr. Ettre is currently the editor of *LCGC's* "Milestones in Chromatography" column, which he has written since 1999 in an effort to help a new generation of chromatographers understand some of the history of the field and the scientists who helped make that history. He is a member of *LCGC's* editorial advisory board.
