In particular, I will not act in a way inconsistent with the purposes and best interests of the Academy.

The Academy is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME®). The Academy expects that every CME and MOC activity certified for credit will be in full compliance with the ACCME® Essential Areas, Elements, Criteria, Policies, and Standards for Commercial Support of Continuing Medical Education.

The Academy has implemented a disclosure process that requires that all individuals in a position to control the content of an educational activity disclose all financial relationships with commercial interest(s), including both compensated relationships and ownership interests purchased with the member's own funds. F. If you or your first-degree relative's role or item received has changed but the relationship with a commercial interest still exists, you must select the "Edit" button to right of the prior disclosure to update your information; then click the "Update" button for the relationship you want to update.

G. All prior disclosures you have entered for yourself or for your first-degree relative are marked to be kept by default. If you need to remove a disclosure, please click on the "delete this relationship" check box for the particular relationship you want to remove; then click "Confirm Delete". New additional disclosures may be entered by clicking on the "Add" button to the right, enter the relationship and then click "Save and Continue" at the bottom of the page.

H. New/additional disclosures may be entered by clicking on the "Enter Additional Financial Disclosures" button below and then clicking "Save and Continue".

FOOTNOTES

¹Financial Relationships: The ACCME requires anyone in control of CME content to disclose relevant financial relationships to the accredited provider. Individuals must also include in their disclosure the relevant financial relationships of a spouse or partner. The ACCME defines relevant financial relationships as financial relationships in any amount that create a conflict of interest and that occurred in the twelve-month period preceding the time that the individual was asked to assume a role controlling content of the CME activity. The ACCME has not set a minimal dollar amount—any amount, regardless of how small, creates the incentive to maintain or increase the value of the relationship. Financial relationships are those relationships in which the individual benefits by receiving a salary, royalty, intellectual property rights, consulting fee, honoraria for promotional speakers' bureau, ownership interest (e.g., stocks, stock options or other ownership interest (whether purchased or provided as compensation), excluding diversified mutual funds), or other financial benefit. Financial benefits are usually associated with roles such as employment, management position, independent contractor (including contracted research), consulting, speaking and teaching, membership on advisory committees or review panels, board membership, and other activities from which remuneration is received, or expected.

²Commercial Interest: A commercial interest, as defined by the ACCME, is any entity producing, marketing, re-selling, or distributing health care goods or services consumed by, or used on, patients. The ACCME does not consider providers of clinical service directly to patients to be commercial interests. A commercial interest is not eligible for ACCME accreditation.

³A first-degree relative is defined as a spouse, parents, brothers, sisters, or children of the member.
