

# Dress for success

Imposing a dress policy not only gives team members guidance on how to dress for the workplace, but it creates a safe working environment for everyone.

The professional atmosphere of this hospital is to be maintained by all employees while present in the hospital. Employees are expected to dress according to the hospital uniform code for their respective positions and to be well-groomed at all times.

- All team members should wear clean khaki pants, a polo shirt with the hospital's logo, and closed-toed shoes.
- Surgical scrubs are not to be worn by team members.
- Hair should be clean, neat, and tidy.
- Nails should be kept short and clean.
- Jewelry must be kept to a minimum since it poses a danger to both you and our patients and is likely to be damaged. Earrings should be small and not dangling. No visible body piercings are permitted other than in the ears.
- Tattoos and other body art should be covered while at work.

If an employee arrives for work in a uniform that is not clean, pressed, and appropriately fitted or arrives for work in any way that does not provide the professional appearance that is expected at this hospital, he or she will be given the opportunity to address the issues immediately and, if necessary, to return home to change. The time to travel home and change will not be paid. Any deliberate breaches of this policy can result in disciplinary action.
