

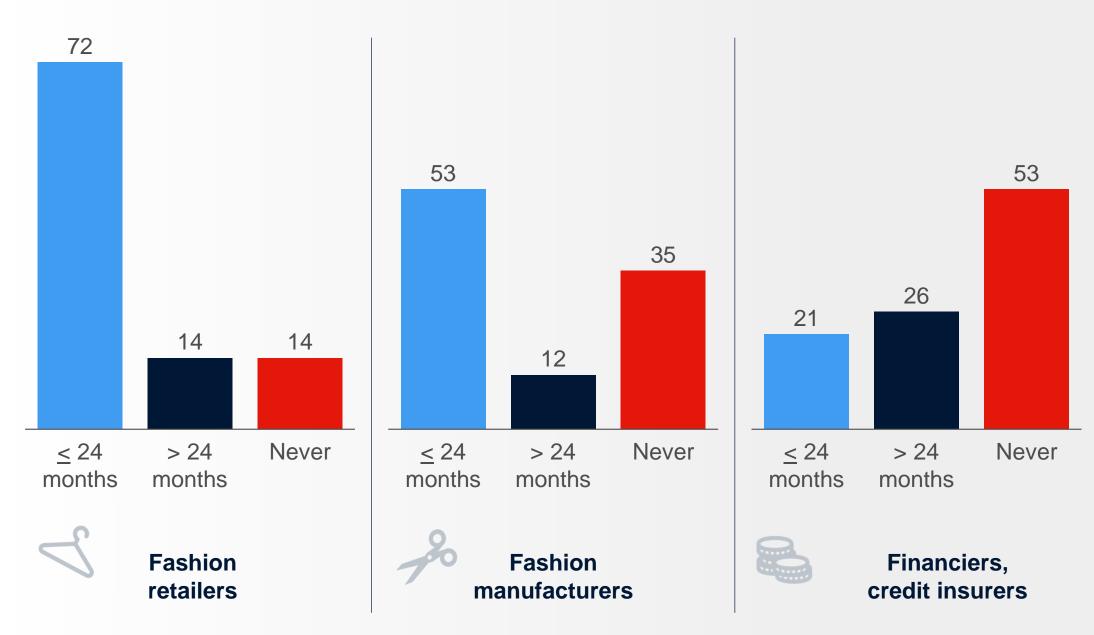

### **Fashion retailers**

Expect slower recovery; one-third does not expect full recovery

High level of scepticism regarding a full recovery

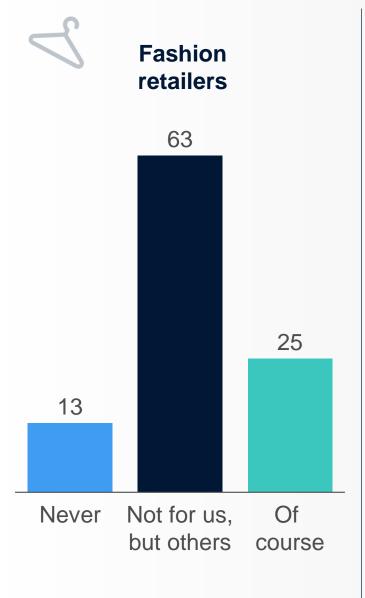

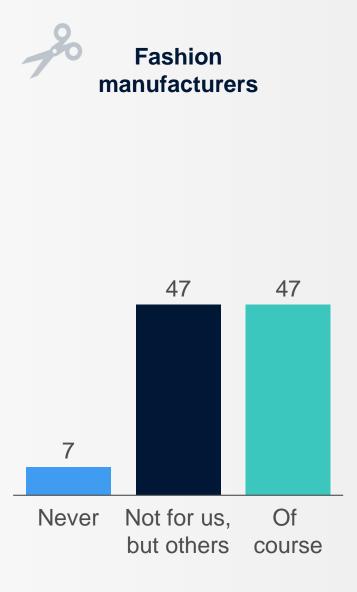

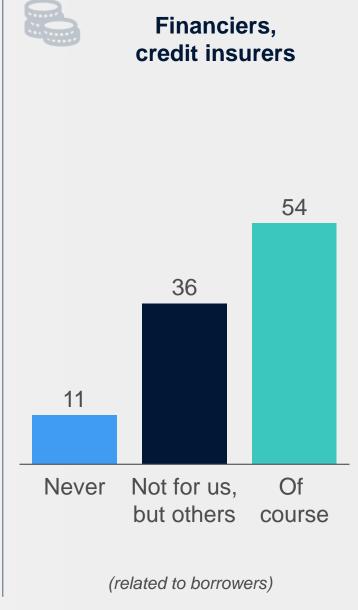

# Social Media platforms are becoming more important as sales channel than a company's own online shop Survey, % of responses by participant group (n=79)



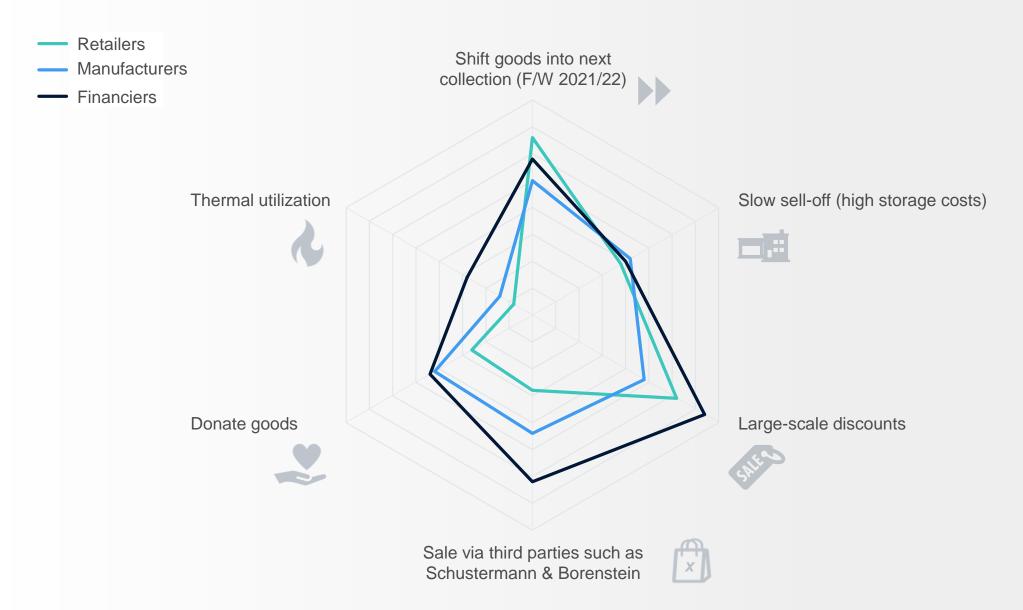






# How important are the following ways to reduce high inventory levels (F/W 2020/21)? Survey, response by participant group (n=75)





# CONCLUSION



- The more one's business model depends on stationary trade, the more optimistic the forecast; but: Retailers and manufacturers should not be guided by hope now, but by realistic assessments
- Strategic challenges and initiatives are assessed similarly however, diverging market expectations increase the danger that the right conclusions will not be drawn
  - Example 'Social media as a sales channel': Only a minority of retailers assume that it will become the most important sales channel unlike manufacturers and financiers. Therefore, it can be assumed that only a minority of retailers are creating the necessary conditions
- Excess inventories must be reduced: While all options are being considered by financiers, retailers and manufacturers are focusing on specific options. Due to the high economic pressure and existing sales risks in the next season all options must be examined now
