Summary



- Tough times for automotive suppliers
 - Overcapacities/ demand still clearly lower than before start of covid-19
 - Supply chain disruptions and high call-off volatility
 - Huge cost increases, esp. materials, energy, labor
- Suppliers forced to take tough cost reduction measures, e.g. material cost reduction programs, capacity reduction, production transfer, site consolidation
- In addition, suppliers need to negotiate with their customers
 - Compensation for cost increases and low volumes in the past
 - Better price points and dynamic price models for the future
 - Improved terms & conditions
- Negotiation success varies a lot
 - Some suppliers can only transfer 15-40% of cost increases to customers
 - The best suppliers transfer nearly all cost increases to their customers
- Right approach key driver for negotiation success

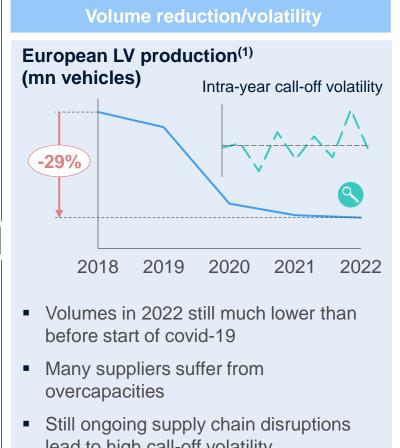
Automotive suppliers are facing huge cost increases and substantial volume reductions/volatilities





- Huge cost increases in last two years (raw materials, energy, labor)
- Suppliers' P&L and liquidity heavily affected
- OEMs keep/ improve profitability via price increases and product mix shifts

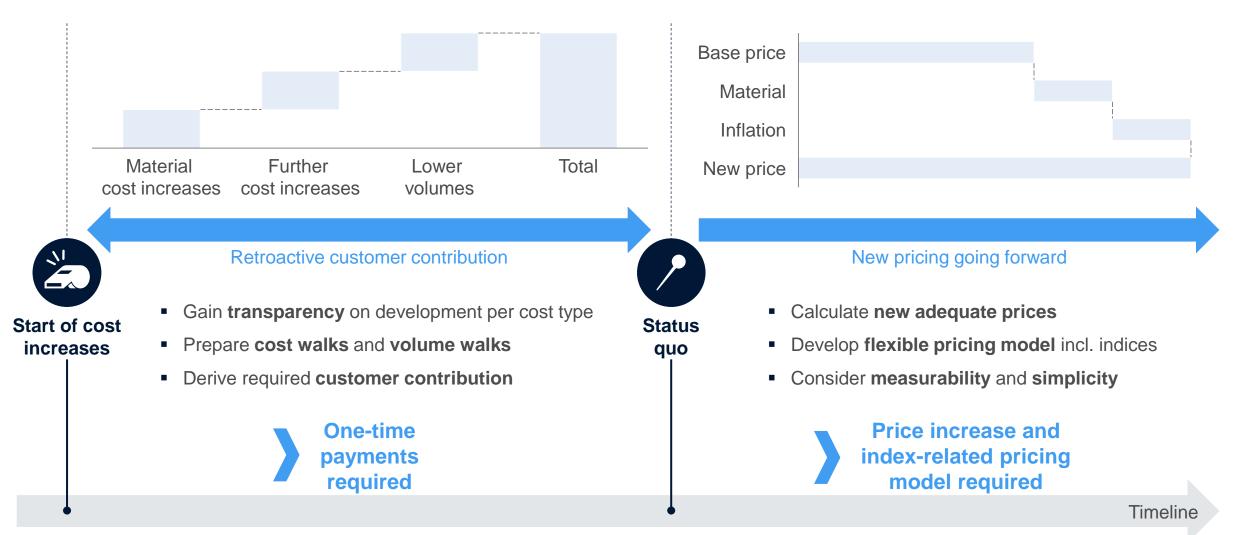

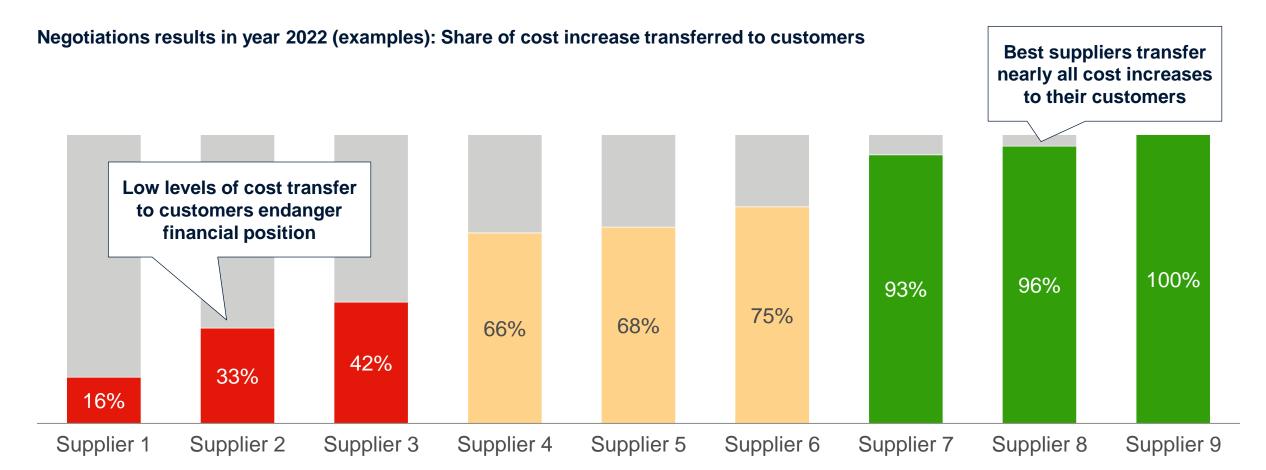
To compensate for cost increases, retroactive customer contribution and new pricing model are essential

Approach is key driver for negotiation results

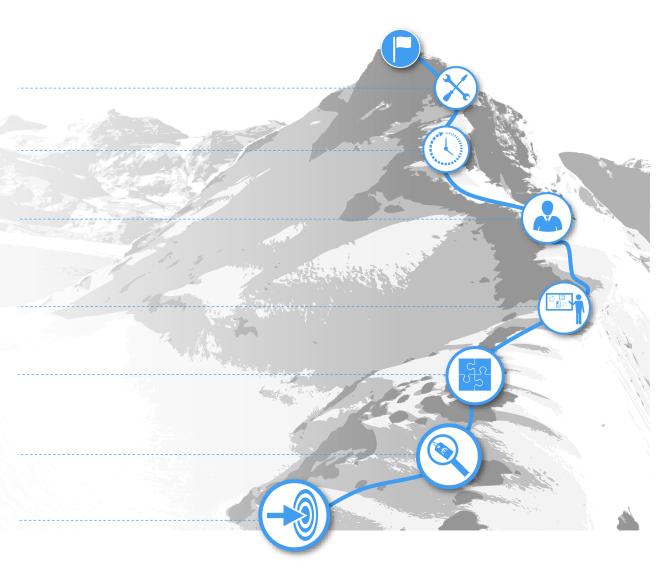


For maximum results the right approach needs to be taken



Success factors

- 7 | Rigorous implementation
- 6 | Tight but realistic timeline
 Definition and communication of timeline
- 5 | Involvement of new people incl. higher ranks on both sides and top management commitment
- 4 | Convincing storyline based on facts and key messages "times have changed" and "now or never"
- 3 | Comprehensive approach considering all key data, events, developments
- 2 | Fact pack detailed to-the point analyses as ammunition
- 1 | Aim high Key target: Major improvements to be realized fast

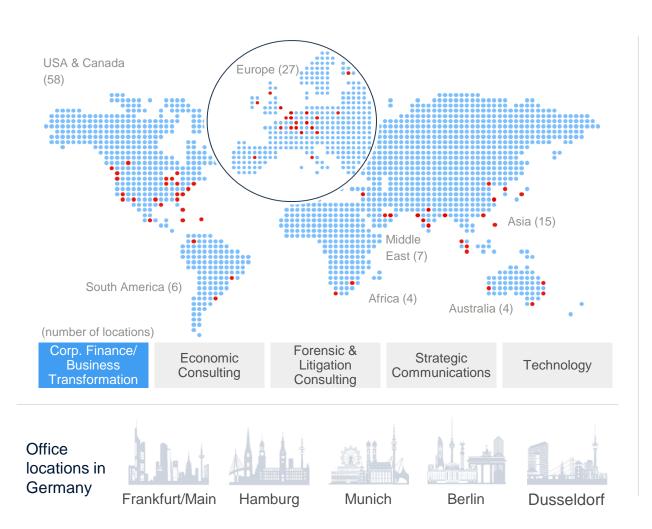

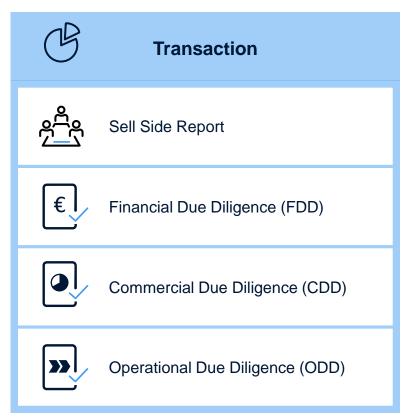
