Conversion & retention is only getting harder





If you could only do **one thing** to drive conversion and retention...

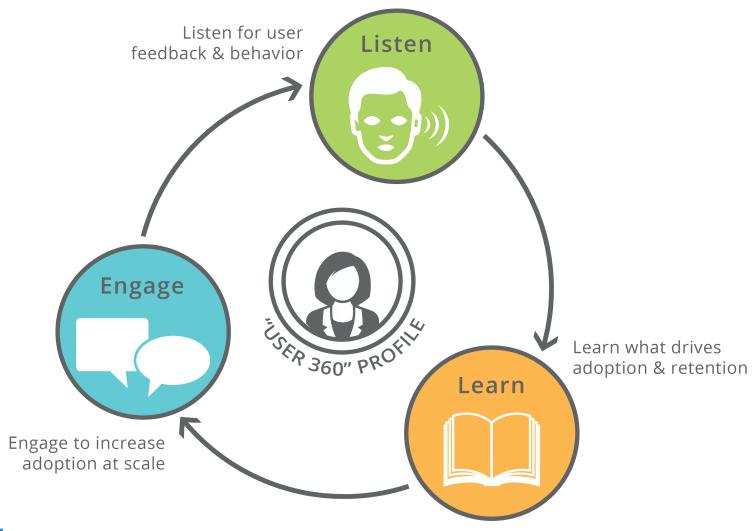


What should it be?





Listen, Learn, Engage to drive adoption





Panel session



Listen to user feedback

Track feedback with Net Promoter® or other types of feedback surveys:

- During freemium / trial period: user's first impression?
- After conversion: why did you buy?
- For non-conversions: why didn't you buy?





Listen to usage behavior

Track usage data by user:

- By day
- By feature
- By volume (things your system did on their behalf, like alerts)





Learn the winning usage patterns

Learn the best (and worst) usage patterns:

- Is there a "happy path" usage pattern that leads to conversion?
- Is there an anti-pattern for churn? Can you link it to survey feedback?





Engage users with purpose

Engage users according to usage behaviors and needs:

- Happy path users: ask for the order
- Users that fell off happy path: intervene
- Dis-engaged users: intervene

Don't forget about inbound engagement such as support, documentation, knowledgebases, etc.





In summary

- Conversion is hard:
 - Lots of competitors
 - Users want immediate gratification
- Use feedback & usage data to learn:
 - Ideal usage pattern
 - Why users convert, or don't
- Engage users according to their behaviors
 - Ready to convert
 - Need more help
 - Bring back from dead
