Please consider the following recommendations for accessing the platform:

- Verify with your respective technology departments that the domains <u>kudoway.com</u> and <u>live.kudoway.com</u> are added to the Whitelist of the firewall and the mail server.
- Connect via Chrome, preferably from a desktop computer or a laptop.
- If you have a Virtual Private Network (VPN), you should disconnect from it.
- The password must contain 10 characters (including at least one capital letter, one number, and one special character).
- Use the email address you indicated in your registration
- A good internet connection is required.

### 6. Languages and Documents

All working sessions will be in the four official languages of the Organization: Spanish, French, English, and Portuguese. There will be simultaneous interpretation in these languages. Documentation for the meeting will be posted on the <u>CICAD webpage</u>.

# 7. Entry Requirements

The United States Government requires travelers to present a passport, which must have a minimum validity of six months, and a copy of the round-trip ticket. Also, all foreign citizens (except those whose countries are members of the Waiver Program traveling only with a valid passport) need a valid visa to enter the United States. Without the appropriate visa, the immigration service will not allow entry to U.S. territory.

### 8. Weather

During the month of November, the daily high temperature in Washington, D.C. typically ranges between 52° and 62°F (11° to 17° C), with evening lows ranging between 38° and 46F (3° to 8° C).
