THE WAR ON DRUGS FUELS THE HIV EPIDEMIC



HARM REDUCTION

The war on drugs has restricted and impeded the deployment of evidence-based HIV prevention and harm reduction services, such as needle-and-syringe programmes and opioid substitution therapy.



CRIMINALISATION

The fear of arrest deters people who use drugs from accessing health services, including HIV testing/prevention. The thousands that are arrested face inhumane prison conditions that increase the risk of HIV transmission.
