Toward a new era for Harm Reduction in Afghanistan 1st of July 2012

We are very pleased to inform you that a Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between **Médecins du Monde (MdM)** and **Organization for Harm Reduction in Afghanistan (OHRA)**. This event took place in Kabul, Afghanistan, on 11th of Saratan 1391 (Shamsi calendar) – 1st of July 2012 (Gregorian calendar).

This major event is a great milestone in the hand over process of the model Harm Reduction program MdM that has been implementing since 2006 in the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.

This program was aiming to introduce Harm Reduction in the country at a time we get first evidences there was a concentrated HIV epidemics among people using drugs. To tackle this challenge, the comprehensive UN package of 9 services has been introduced and implemented on a 5 years timeframe in partnership with Ministry of Public Health. Some major steps were NSP in 2006, ART in 2009 and methadone as OST in 2010. But MdM was as well concerned to enlarge the range of services delivered to people using drugs and has defined a 12 components package including peer based Naloxone distribution to manage overdose cases.



Furthermore this program aims to disseminate the provision of Harm Reduction services all over the country throughout a major capacity building component. Afghan Harm Reduction NGOs, law enforcement officers, religious leaders, others key local stakeholders have been trained throughout the national Training and Resource Centre established in Kabul in 2009. This comprehensive approach contributes actively to the promotion and the social acceptability of Harm Reduction in Afghanistan.

OHRA/MdM Memorandum of Understanding objective is to hand over this program to a national NGO. Currently a first partnership agreement has been signed on behalf on this MoU. This partnership agreement hands over immediately 10 out of the 12 Harm Reduction components to OHRA. A second partnership will be signed in 2013 to go on in the hand over process.

We consider that a process of "afghanization" of the model program is a crucial prerequisite to go further in scale up and increase the nationwide coverage rate. We hope this process will as well contribute to reduce current barriers to methadone.
