







Ensuring more proportionate, humane and effective approaches to drug policy

For the past 50 years, drug policies worldwide have been characterised by the imposition of disproportionately severe punishments against all those engaged in the illicit drug trade. This has led to an overload of criminal justice systems, prison overcrowding, and human rights violations – without reducing the overall scale of the global illicit drug market. As the UNGASS approaches, the issue of proportionality in sentencing for drug offences is gaining prominence.

This side event, organised by the Permanent Mission of Uruguay in Vienna, the International Drug Policy Consortium, Penal Reform International and Dejusticia, will provide an overview of the concept of proportionality, review examples of best practice, and offer a set of recommendations for national-level policy reform and for the UNGASS.
