The programme consists of 4 modules that each run for one week. The scientific directors will moderate each module. In the afternoon of the last week, the main focus will be the integration of new research findings in addiction treatment and possible directions for the further development of new interventions. Lectures will address the application of insights about implicit drugs-related cognitions, the use of new medications and the introduction of e-health and online interventions in addiction treatment. Two excursions to service providers are part of this course. Topics and lecturers are subject to minor changes. An extensive and up to date programme can be found on the website.
