

**Tool (OAT)** 

The Organisational Assessment Tool optimised for general and youth-led drug policy reform/harm reduction organisations was created as part of the open nature of the project and its expected impact on other organisations that can benefit from cooperatively tackling their key areas of improvements. It revolves around the three pillars of the project (1. Leadership Transition, 2. Institutional knowledge/memory, and 3. Long-term strategy). However, by design, it can and should be modified as needed in its specific content as well as reimplemented periodically.

## **Improvements**

#### 1. Ranking System

Identifies and lists areas that rank lower on the assessment. The totalled score from each area can be compared to others and its own in reassessments.

#### 2. Nuanced Data Collection

Moves beyond simple YES/NO choices for all questions. Likert system provides more nuanced data and a clearer understanding of each area's status.

#### **3. Informing Hiring Priorities**

Results can be used to inform inclusive hiring priorities and diversity, especially in areas that are not well covered and need additional human resources.

#### 4. (Youth) Drug Policy & Harm Reduction

Specific drug policy and harm reduction questions including basic and youth-specific assessment of important organisational aspects in the field.

#### 5. Wellbeing, Inclusion & Diversity

Reccommends improvements in internal wellbeing policies and care protocols, disability-inclusive processes, diversity measures and more.
