



STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO GET STARTED




1. Make a plan

First, identify the areas you'd like to enhance with outdoor illumination, perhaps it would help to sketch the space. Then start planning how you'll optimise it.




2. Consider style & feeling

Do you prefer classic designs, or is modern and minimalist more your style? Consider how dramatic, majestic, subtle or calm you'd like your outdoor space to look and feel after dark.




3. Identify needs

Perhaps you would like to illuminate the paths around your home, or maybe you wish to highlight the stairs, a wall or other objects. Consider whether you prefer sensors, an app or just a regular switch.



4. Find your lamps


Take pictures of your outdoor spaces and note which lamps you would prefer to go where. Pick out the lamps you like and choose between bollards, wall lamps, pendants etc.



5. Get professional help



LIGHTING YOUR ENTRANCE AREA

Warm, comfortable lighting by the entrance to your home welcomes both you and your guests. When opening the door, soft shadows from a reflected or diffused light create pleasant lighting which is also flattering. Great lighting is also practical, helping you to easily find your keys when arriving at home.



BOLLARDS

Bollards can be used in flowerbeds or along a wall or other structures. They can also act as beautiful focal points or beacons. Place them so they illuminate beautifully without being in the way.



WALL LAMP FUNCTIONS

Wall lamps work well on buildings where they emphasise the architecture and softly illuminate the surroundings and paths.


GLARE FREE LIGHT

Light reflected from lampshades provides beautiful soft shadows while being very comfortable and glare free.

LIGHTING YOUR ROOFTOP AND TERRACE

By choosing the right lighting you can transform the look and feel of your terrace or rooftop completely, not to mention the experience of using these spaces after dark. Consider using different kinds of indirect and direct light, which can create a great atmosphere by mixing lamps and placing them at various heights.

CREATING AN AMBIENCE



Pairing a low bollard and a low wall lamp provides diffused lighting at lower levels, which not only creates a cosy ambience but also helps with wayfinding.



Choosing a low bollard and a high wall lamp allows light to be cast over different levels, providing an even light distribution ideal for both eating areas and wayfinding.



Using light from a low bollard lights up the ground surrounding the lamp providing a diffused light, perfect for wayfinding and creating an atmosphere.





LIGHTING YOUR GARDEN AREA

During the daytime your garden has its own special appeal, but in the evening good lighting can provide a touch of magic, creating lots of happy memories after sunset too. Create depth and perspective in the garden with low lamps, which make it look just as fantastic, even when viewed from the inside. And don't forget the front garden. High quality, well thought through lighting looks great when passing by and can be used to highlight both landscaping and special details.





Proper lighting in your garden gives you more time to enjoy it



The bollard is the most common garden lamp. The ones with a round symmetrical light distribution are often the most effective, as they create small ambient islands of light, highlighting the natural surroundings.

USING ROUND SYMMETRICAL LIGHT DISTRIBUTION

Use bollards with round symmetrical lighting for a sitting area
to create that cosy ambience or in flowerbeds to light up the garden
in the evening time.




EXAMPLE OF HOW TO INSTALL AJ GARDEN


Please note that AJ Garden differs from Flindt Garden and Bysted Garden as it always has a cable. There are no electrical installations inside the pole, unlike the two others.

	SPIKE	ANCHOR	BASEPLATE
Application	Put directly into the ground.	Fixed in concrete.	For surface mounting.
Installation	Easy to install. Does not require a certified electrician for installation, you can do it yourself.	Requires installation by certified electrician. Use cable ducts for in-ground installation, to protect the cables inside and ensure safe installation.	Requires installation by certified electrician. Use cable ducts for in-ground installation, to protect the cables inside and ensure safe installation. Also possible with cables running over ground below a terrace deck.

Notes	A spirit level is included to help ensure that the fixture is installed at the correct angle. The base is slightly raised to allow space for the cable to run on top of the ground.	The screws are level with the base plate. The screws are black and are included with your fixture.	The base plate version is fixed to the surface using four screws, that are level with the baseplate. The screws are black and delivered with the fixture.





LIGHTING FOR PATIO AND ORANGERY

Appropriate lighting on the patio or in an orangery creates wonderful ambience and enables social activities long after sunset, allowing you to make much better use of outside spaces as an extension of your home. Decking, stairs and other small obstacles can also be illuminated, making it easy and pleasant to move about.





Create a soft ambience by using a low hanging wall lamp with opal or a half-shade.

Create good working light by using a high wall lamp with directed light from a cut-off lamp shade.

LIGHTING YOUR DRIVEWAYS AND PATHWAYS

Marking the driveway to your garage or parking space with well-situated lighting will help guide you home, particularly if the driveway is long. A row of lamps that emit discrete and glare free downward directed light is both wonderful to look at and practical, helping you navigate home comfortably, avoiding obstacles or objects left on the driveway.











LIGHTING A PATH




Using a low bollard with shaded symmetrical lighting gives a soft light to the path as well as the garden area.



Lighting a path from a high bollard with asymmetrical lighting directs all the light to the path while the garden remains dark.



Using a low wall lamp with opal and a half-shaded light creates a soft light on the path and illuminates the wall.



WALL LAMPS


Wall lamps with a downward directed or diffused light work very well on a fence or wall, lighting up a doorway or a driveway.






BOLLARDS

A bollard is a lamppost typically under a metre in height. Its downward directed light ensures that it does not disturb the dark night sky. Bollards come with a round symmetrical or an asymmetrical light distribution, each of which lights up the ground below a little differently, working perfectly on paths, in driveways or next to an entrance, for example.

SYMMETRICAL LIGHTING

Lighting a path with symmetrical lighting from bollards creates a path with soft spots of light and illuminates both the path and the surrounding area.






ASYMMETRICAL LIGHTING

Lighting a path with asymmetrical light from bollards creates a well-lit pathway without lighting up the surroundings.

LIGHTING YOUR GARAGE

Subtle lighting around your garage will not only look better and make it more pleasant to arrive home to at night, it will also make it easier for you to see where you are going. Top it off by marking the path from your parking space to the main entrances.









LIGHTING YOUR WAYFINDING AREAS

Bollards on paths or wall lamps mounted on the building help emphasize the architecture of your home tastefully. However, they also have the practical function of lighting the way and guiding you when you are outside after dark.





Wayfinding lamps do more than help guide you they also create a comfortable ambience and enhance the appearance of your home

Bollards are ideal as wayfinding lamps when there is room near the building or on the other side of the path facing the building, where they create islands of light, which when placed in a row, illuminate the area like a path.


