Our Chosen Charities this year:

The Stem Cell Unit at Treliske Hospital

The Stem Cell Transplant Service at Treliske provides treatment for patients with Myeloma and Lymphoma. What makes the service unique is that it does this in conjunction with Derriford Hospital in Plymouth and Torbay Hospital. The three sites are regulated as a single entity and work together as the Southwest Stem Cell Programme.

The treatment is a long, complex process with a lot of associated regulation around send people away for this kind of treatment. Because of Treliske's unique programme, they can treat patients locally with their chemotherapy and then when they achieve remission, they harvest their stem cells and send them to Plymouth where they are stored in liquid nitrogen. A few weeks later, the patient is sent to Derriford for a final chemotherapy session and the stem cells are then re-introduced and the patient returns to Cornwall.

Man Down Cornwall

Man Down is a Cornwall based non-profit Community Interest Company. They provide informal peer-support talking groups all over Cornwall for men with mental health concerns. Believing that "together we can end the stigma and reduce the number of male suicides in Cornwall. You are not alone."

PLOUGHING CLASSES

As per the entry form please be on the ground at 9.00am, ready to start at 9.30am. You have $4^{1}/_{2}$ hours to complete the plot which will be judged.

Please be reminded:

No one other than the driver, and in particular, no child, may ride in or on any tractor or similar vehicle designed to be occupied solely by the driver. It is against the law for children under 13 to ride on or in a tractor or similar.

CLASS 1: Match ploughing (Semi Digger)

CLASS 2: Open - No Match Ploughs, Non-YFC; to be ploughed one way

CLASS 3: Reversible - To be ploughed both ways

CLASS 4: YFC - Conventional, to be ploughed one way

CLASS 5: Under 18 - Conventional, to be ploughed one way

CLASS 6: Under 16 - Conventional, to be ploughed one way

CLASS 7: Vintage Class - Tractor & Trailer Ploughs pre-1955

CLASS 8: Vintage Class - Tractor & Hydraulic Ploughs pre-1965

CLASS 9: Ladies Class - Conventional, to be ploughed one way

CLASS 10: Heavy Horse Senior

CLASS 11: Heavy Horse Novice

CLASS 12: Novice Class - To be ploughed one way

CLASS 13: Intermediate Class - To be ploughed both ways

CLASS 14: Classic Tractor – Pre-1965

A novice is someone who has never achieved 1st place in a ploughing class in any ploughing match.

Please make sure you enter the CORRECT Class; any doubts, please speak to the chief ploughing steward in advance of sending your Entry

Rules for Ploughing

1. PLOUGHS

- a. Tractor ploughs to be fitted with skimmers.
- b. Tailpieces are allowed the maximum size to be 26cm long and 22cm wide.

 The end of tailpiece to be no more than 32cm from the end of the mouldboard.
- c. Plough bodies must be in a 'ploughing' position at all times.
- d. All plough bodies must be used when finishing.
- e. Extraneous attachments that manipulate the furrows or scratches are not allowed.

2. TIME ALLOWED

a. All competitors to be ready to start at 9.00am

b. Ploughing to start at 9.30am and all ground must be finished by 2.00pm.

- c. All openings to be ready for judging by 10.30am
- d. Plots not opened by 10.30am will not receive any points for opening
- e. Failure to complete in allotted time will not receive any points for closing up and finishing.
- f. 15 minutes extra time for any cast-off done after the ploughing has commenced.
- g. At the finishing signal a competitor can complete the run without stopping.

PENALTY FOR FAILING TO FINISH - DISQUALIFICATION.

3. OPENING

- a. Conventional ploughing double opening no land shall be left unturned.
- b. Reversible ploughing single furrow opening with right-hand bodies.

4. START

- a. Conventional ploughing start to consist of 11 or 12 furrows.
- b. Reversible ploughing start consists of 12 furrows
- c. Horse Ploughing start consists of 8 furrows
- c. Competitors to cast towards the next highest number plot.

5. FINISH

- a. Conventional ploughing Finish to consist of last 8 furrows.
- b. Reversible ploughing finish to consist of last 15 or 16 furrows (i.e., 3 furrow ploughs 15 furrows, 2 or furrow ploughs 16 furrows).
- d. Last furrow to be ploughed towards competitor's own start.

6. DEPTH

Depth to be reached on completion of start and adhered to until commencing the finish.

- a. Tractor ploughing minimum depth 8 inches.
- b. Vintage tractor ploughing minimum depth 6 inches.

7. VINTAGE PLOUGHING


- a. Plough bodies must be made for the plough at the time of manufacture.
- b. Skimmers and tailpieces optional.
- c. Tailpieces should not be adapted to manipulate the furrows or scratches.

8. GENERAL

- a. Rolling not allowed penalty 20 points deduction.
- b. Twin tractor wheels not allowed.
- c. Three sighting poles only assistance to set and remove is allowed. No other assistance allowed.
- d. Handling, treading or shaping of scratches or furrows is not allowed (for exception see rule 8b).
- e. Only one wheel mark allowed at the finish in tractor ploughing.
- f. Any abuse or dispute by a competitor with an official of the Helston & St Keverne YFC Committee is not acceptable and will be penalised.
- g. The Club is fully aware of the legal requirements concerning the correct use of rebated fuel (red diesel) and the licensing of tractors. However, it is the responsibility of the individual concerned to ensure that they are operating within the law. For further guidance please refer to www.hmrc.gov.uk

FINAL DECISION

Any questions arising and not provided for in these rules shall be decided by the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding.

GROUP 1: Tractor Pull 100 to 120hp

Rules for Tractor Pull

- 1. Tractors must be 4WD.
- 2. Tractors must have working trailer braking.
- 3. All weights must be fitted prior to sign in.
- 4. Competitors are reminded to drive responsibly in the field.
- 5. No one other than the driver, and in particular, no child, may ride in or on any tractor or similar vehicle designed to be occupied solely by the driver. It is against the law for children under 13 to ride on or in a tractor or similar.
- 6. Stewards' decisions are final
- 7. Sign in from 1:30pm Pulling to commence by 2pm

Recipe for set recipe (marble cake):

Ingredients

- 225g <u>butter</u>, softened
- 225g <u>caster sugar</u>
- 4 <u>eggs</u>
- 225g <u>self-raising flour</u>
- 3 tbsp <u>milk</u>
- 1 tsp <u>vanilla extract</u>
- 2 tbsp cocoa powder

Method

STEP 1

Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4. Grease a 20cm cake tin, line the bottom with a circle of greaseproof paper.

STEP 2

Beat 225g butter and 225g caster sugar together, then add 4 eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition.

STEP 3

Fold through 225g self-raising flour, 3 tbsp milk and 1 tsp vanilla extract until the mixture is smooth.

STEP 4

Divide the mixture between 2 <u>bowls</u>. Stir 2 tbsp cocoa powder into the mixture in one of the bowls. Take 2 spoons and use them to dollop the chocolate and vanilla cake mixes into the tin alternately.

STEP 5

When all the mixture has been used up, tap the bottom on your work surface to ensure that there aren't any air bubbles.

STEP 6

Take a <u>skewer</u> and swirl it around the mixture in the tin a few times to create a marbled effect.

• STEP 7

Bake the <u>cake</u> for 45-55 mins until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Turn out onto a <u>cooling</u> rack and leave to cool.
