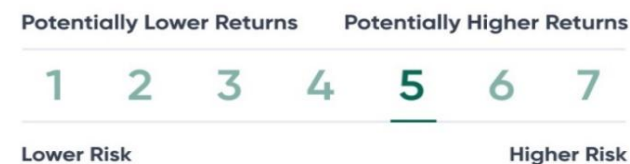
Description of this fund

The Kernel Australia 100 Fund's investment objective is to provide a return (before tax, fees and expenses) that closely matches the return on the S&P/ASX 100 Index.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Kernel Australia 100 Fund :



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

What fees are investors charged?

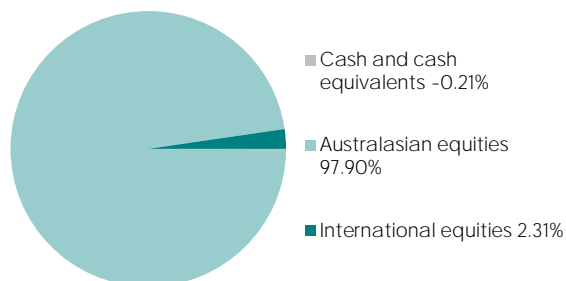
Example of how this applies to an investor

Emma had \$10,000 in the fund on 13 August 2025 and did not make any further contributions. On 31 March 2026, Emma received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$756 (that is 7.56% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Emma a total return after tax of \$680 for the period.
