### Fund overview

The Kernel Global ESG Fund is designed to track the S&P World Net Zero 2050 Paris-Aligned ESG Ex-Non-Pharma Animal Testing NZD Index ("Global ESG Index") by investing in globally listed financial products across countries and sectors. Companies are screened on business activities and company weightings are modified based on a company's environmental, social, and governance (ESG) characteristics and climate alignment scores, as calculated by the index provider.

### Benefits

The Global ESG fund can be used in a variety of investment strategies:

- Portfolio diversification
- Access to a global growth sector
- Robust integration of ESG values, incorporating exclusions on gambling and non-pharma Animal Testing involvement, and climate-related targets aligned with the 2016 Paris agreement

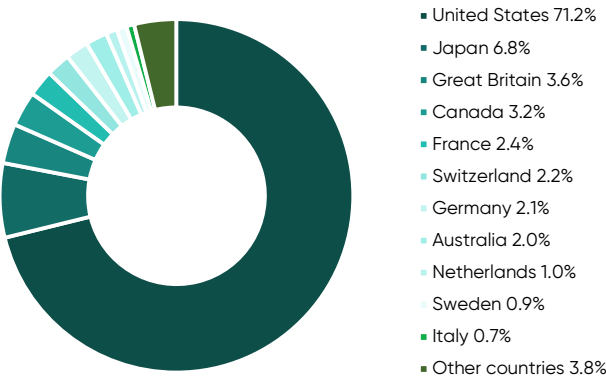

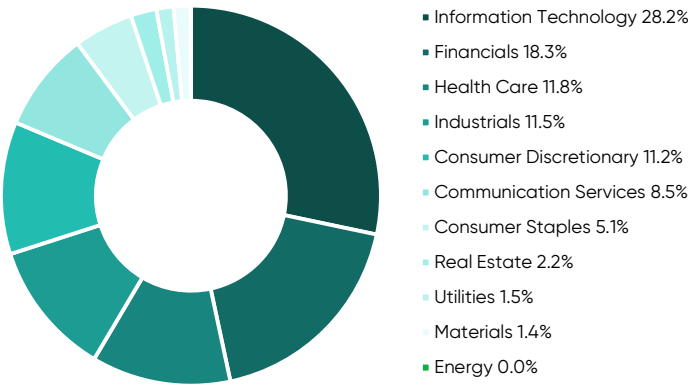
Where does the fund invest?

Carbon Footprint:
