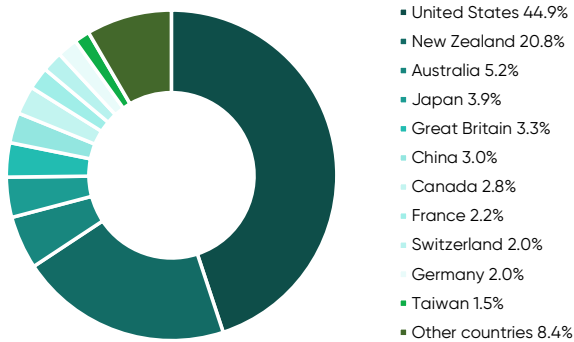
\$10,000 invested 5 years ago⁶: \$19,583

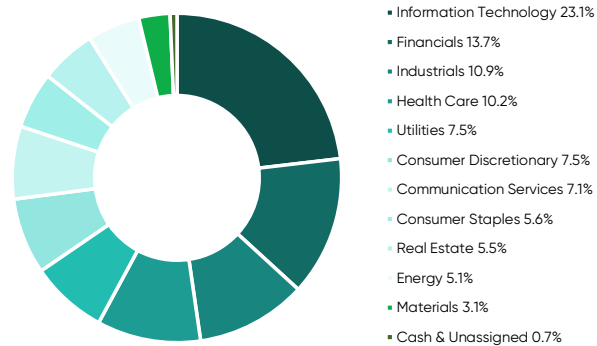
Where does the fund invest?
