Gwen Jacobson - 20 Years a Volunteer Thousands of Meals on Wheels Delivered to Needy Seniors!

Hi, I'm Gwen Jacobson, and here is my take on our Redwood Coast Senior Center and the 'Meals on Wheels program.

My husband Bill and I have lived in Mendocino for 45 years. We moved here from Oakland in 1977 after purchasing the Joshua Grindle house to make it into a bed and breakfast inn. We were innkeepers for 11 years. I volunteered from the get-go. First, I was treasurer of the Kelley House for 11 years, after which I became a board member of the Mendocino Music Festival and, about 11 years later, was on the Mendocino Fire Protection Board, also for 11 years. I became a Meals on Wheels driver during my time with the fire district. My friend, Jean Graham, was delivering meals and suggested that I come along with her to see what it was all about, and I was hooked. That was 20 years ago. She and I enjoy delivering meals to this day. Jean delivers on Mondays. I am the Wednesday driver. I have always felt that sharing my time with the community in which I live is essential. Not only are people drawn to our coastal community by the natural beauty, but they are also drawn here because of all the mind-expanding cultural and social



opportunities presented and made possible by those who give back to the community by volunteering their time.

It's not a one-way street. I know first-hand that I have received as much as, if not more, through volunteering than I have given. I have performed tasks I never dreamed were within my capabilities. I have learned much from interacting with the varied and interesting people I have met on my volunteering journey. I have had a lot of fun and have added stories to my conversational repertoire.

As a Meals on Wheels driver, I have been on roads I would not have found nor ventured down (Albion, you have a 'rabbit warren' of roads!). I have met folks from all walks of life, had interesting conversations, and received as many smiles as I have given when handing someone a warm meal.

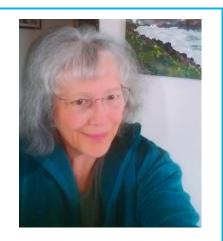
