March 17th St. Patrick's Day, or the Feast of St. Patrick, is a cultural and religious celebration, marking the death of St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. It also commemorates the arrival of Christianity in Ireland in the year 432. St. Patrick was born in Britain in the late 4th century A.D to Roman Parents. captured



by pirates as a child and brought to Ireland. He was called to Christianity and escaped his captors after six years. He returned to Ireland as a missionary and combined Irish pagan beliefs with Christian sacrament through his teachings.

He was not Irish, instead he was English. His given name was Maewyn Succat. His name was changed to Patrick. St. Patrick used a Shamrock – a young spring of clover- to teach the pagans about the Holy Trinity. The shamrock is the official flower of Ireland and associated with St.

Patrick.

Blue was the color originally associated with St. Patrick. The color blue was featured in both the royal court and on ancient Irish flags until 1798 when the color green became associated with the day.

Ash Wednesday begins the Lenten Season on March 5th and is celebrated on Wednesday seven weeks before Easter and the day after Mardi Gras.

The ashes used for Ash Wednesday come from the burning of palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations. Ash Wednesday is always 46 days before Easter Sunday². March 8th Daylight Savings Time begins at 2:00AM that night. Arizona has not observed Daylight Saving Time since 1967, but there is one portion of Arizona that continues to observe it—Navajo Nation. The Native American territory, which also traverses the state lines of Utah and New Mexico, elected to adopt Daylight Saving Time because they didn't want to put the communities on two different clocks. The smaller Hopi reservation of the Navajo Nation is the only segment of the territory that chose not to observe Daylight Saving Time because it lies within Arizona.



March 14, 2025 the next full Moon known as the Full Worm Moon will occur at 2:55 a.m. Eastern Time (Thursday, March 13 at 11:55 p.m. Pacific). The Full Worm Moon will undergo a total lunar eclipse at that time.

March's full Moon is called the Worm Moon to celebrate the earthworms that spring to life as winter ends. These little critters enrich the soil for your spring gardens!

March 20, 2025 is the first day of spring on Thursday at 5:01 a.m. EDT (2:01 a.m. Pacific). For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, this is marked by the arrival of the spring equinox the official start of the spring season

Traditionally, the first day of spring is on March 21, but astronomers and calendar manufacturers alike now say that the spring season starts on March 20 in all time zones in North America.

It's time to prepare your hummingbird feeders. With the coming of Spring the arrival of thousands of beautiful hummingbirds -the world's small bird- will begin its annual journey northward..

Hummingbirds return to Arizon<u>a</u> typically begin their journey at the end of winter and into the spring. So, expect to see these graceful creatures from late February to May.



Because of their small size and quick wing speed, hummingbirds can fly up to 1,300 miles in one stretch, so it's no surprise they cover so much territory during their migration. Arizona, particularly the southeastern corner of the

state, is home to more hummingbird species than almost anywhere else across the country!

Starting Feb. 25 Arizona State Parks and Trails will be raising fees on entrances, camping, and tour tickets for its more than 30 parks to help support park operations.

Instead of the current choice between the standard annual pass with restrictions for \$75 or premium pass for \$200, one pass will be available for \$200 that includes all parks with no restrictions. This will provide entry for up to four adults in a single vehicle into all parks for one year.

Camping fees will range from \$25 for rustic (no hook-up) sites to \$75 for oversized sites with full hook-ups at Fool Hollow Lake Recreation Area. Day use entry fees will range between \$10 and \$30 for adults depending on park and seasonality. Tours at Kartchner Caverns State Park will rise from \$23 to \$30 for people age 14 and up, and tours at Riordan Mansion State Historic Park will rise from \$12 to \$18 for people age 14 and up. Volunteer cuddlers needed for babies at Valleywise Health NICU

Valleywise Health is currently looking for more volunteers. Officials say they have three right now, but they are looking to recruit up to 40 NICU cuddlers. You have to be 18 and complete a background test and a drug test, among other tests and immunizations.

You also have to get trained on how to swaddle and hold the babies safely. Volunteers are asked to commit four hours a week for a minimum of 100 hours.

"And so now we know human touch is very, very important for a developing brain," said Karine Soto, who works in the NICU. "It helps decrease cortisol levels. It helps with weight gain. It helps stabilize their vital signs."
