CELEBRATING 89 YEARS OF SOCIAL SECURITY

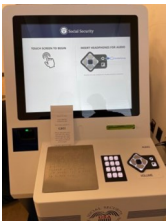
For nearly 90 years, Social Security has provided income protection to millions of retirees, people with disabilities, their dependents, and families who've lost a family member who worked and paid Social Security taxes before they died. In addition to paying benefits, we issue millions of Social Security numbers each year, maintain wage records to make sure workers get the benefits they have earned, and much more. The scope of what we do is enormous, and we are proud to serve the American people. Whether providing service online at SSA.gov, over the telephone, or in person, our goal is to help you understand your eligibility for benefits and the best way to apply for them.

We also work to make sure our programs, particularly Supplemental Security Income (SSI), remain accessible to you. SSI provides monthly payments to adults and children with a disability or blindness, and to adults age 65 and older, who have limited income and resources. This year we announced that we are expanding SSI eligibility criteria by:

- Updating the public assistance household definition.
- Removing food from in-kind support and maintenance.
- Expanding rental subsidy nationwide.

SOCIAL SECURITY INSTALLS NEW KIOSKS TO IMPROVE CUSTOMER CHECK-IN PROCESS

At Social Security we strive to make our services more accessible while maintaining your privacy. We installed new kiosks in most of our local offices to make it easier for you to check in and conduct business with us. The kiosks are private, easy to use without assistance, and provide consistent service to our customers.

Modifications to earlier screens have improved the check-in process, especially for our customers who are blind or have low vision. Each kiosk is compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and includes the following features:

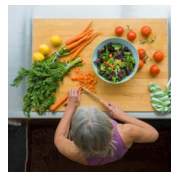
- Accessible keypads.
- Audio headphone jacks (complimentary headphones are available upon request).
- Braille instructions for how to use the kiosk and report any accessibility issues.
- Built-in thermal printers and ticket dispensers.
- Enhanced 508-compatible check-in software.
- Touchscreen monitors with privacy filters.

These kiosks are just one more way we're improving the customer service experience in our offices. Last year, we began offering Mobile Check-in Express. It allows customers to use their mobile device to scan a QR code at their local office to check in for scheduled and walk-in appointments.

By turning on their device's location services and mobile notifications, visitors receive:

- An electronic ticket so they know their place in line.
- An alert when an employee is ready to help them.
- Information about their interview location.
- An invitation to participate in our feedback survey.

October 12th is National Savings Day. It serves as an important reminder to plan for your financial future. Social Security is a vital part of any financial plan. We have online tools to help you understand your potential benefits and how they fit into your financial future.

Regardless of your age, you should periodically review your *Social Security Statement (Statement)* using your personal *my Social Security* account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount. Your *Statement* is an easy-to-read summary of the estimated benefits you and your family could receive, including retirement, disability, and survivors benefits. You should also review your *Statement* annually to confirm your earnings history.

The retirement calculator in your personal *my Social Security* account allows you to check various benefit estimate scenarios based on the age you plan to retire. You can compare the effect different earnings and retirement start dates could have on your future benefit amount.

Please let friends and family members know how they can prepare for their financial future by signing in to their secure *my Social Security* account. If they don't have an account, they can create one at www.ssa.gov/myaccount.

GENESIS PROJECT, PINAL COUNTY'S ONLY SOUP KITCHEN, FORCED TO CLOSE ITS DOORS WHEN LEASE EXPIRES

The only soup kitchen in Pinal County is being forced to close its doors soon after 10 years at the same location. Genesis Project was told their lease would not be renewed and that they needed to leave in three months. Many people in Apache Junction rely heavily on the Genesis Project and hearing that they'll close soon has left some of them questioning where they'll get their next meal.

"Everybody has a story here," says one regular, Holly Marcotte. "I have my story. It just so happens mine's a success story, although I'm struggling for food." "Genesis is a light of hope". Holly Marcotte is disabled on a fixed income. Her main mode of transportation is her electric wheelchair. "I'm just up the street, so I can bring my power chair up here and I can get a hot meal and a cold meal to go like a pizza or sandwich," she said. That's how she's able to get her meals at the Genesis Project.

"Genesis is a light of hope for those people who come here. It's not just homeless people, it's disabled people and seniors," Marcotte said. "What happens when Genesis stays open is it helps the community and reminds the community that everyone is a person and everyone deserves life and deserves a meal," said Genesis Project success story, Janice McCarthy.

deserves a meal," said Genesis Project success story, Janice McCarthy. For years, McCarthy would go to the Genesis Project for meals until she achieved sobriety. Executive Director Trinity Cole says Genesis Project was notified on Aug. 1 that they'd need to be moved out by Oct. 31 at 5 p.m.

Genesis Project is committed to finding a new location. Cole says the nonprofit is committed to continuing services to the more than 200 people they serve every day, but desperately needs to find a new location soon. "I know that they cannot go without a meal, hydration, clothing and services, so it's tremendously concerning not knowing where we're going to go and when we'll be able to serve," Cole said. The property manager spoke briefly on the phone but only reiterated that the lease would not be renewed.

SOCIAL SECURITY ADMINISTRATION DIGITIZES OR REMOVES SIGNATURE REQUIREMENTS FOR MANY FORMS MOVE EASES BURDEN ON MILLIONS OF CUSTOMERS

Social Security Administration (SSA) announced progress this year to reduce customer burden by transitioning wet (physical) signature requirements to digital signatures for over 30 forms as well as removing the signature requirements altogether for 13 forms. These actions simplify application processes for people, including removing a potential reason for claims to be sent back or denied.

“Across forms that Americans use most often, we’re eliminating as many pain points as possible, from helping people sign at the click of a button to reducing the need to drive or mail something in whenever possible,” said Martin O’Malley, Commissioner of Social Security. “This means faster and more error-free processing and better service for our customers, who deserve a government that meets their needs efficiently and effectively.”

As a result of this work, SSA will now allow an electronic signature rather than a wet signature for more than 30 forms, which make up 90% of the most commonly used forms by SSA customers in local field offices. Collectively, these forms represent about 14 million signed forms submitted annually.

Furthermore, also this year, SSA has removed the signature requirement entirely for 13 of its most commonly used forms totaling about 1 million submissions in volume annually. This includes removing the signature requirement for the Medical Source Opinion of Patient’s Capability to Manage Benefits (Form SSA-787, which has a total annual volume of 768,000), the Letter to Employer Requesting Wage Information (Form SSA-L4201, which has an annual volume of 133,000), and Request for Reconsideration/Disability Cessation Right to Appear (Form SSA-789, which has an annual volume of 49,000). Customers may also upload many of the 13 forms online, further reducing the burden felt by customers.

To build on this progress, SSA is considering removal of signature requirements on other forms that would ease requirements on about 1 million additional transactions.

Social Security works to pay the right people t the right time in the correct amount. These efforts ensure we maintain strong anti-fraud protections while removing onerous requirements that are not serving their intended purposes.

These efforts also complement other initiatives to modernize and streamline operations. The agency is expanding paperless communication options for the millions of [my Social Security](#) users so they can see their online Social Security *Statement*, track the status of their claims, and calculate potential retirement benefits. Notices from across 60 categories are now provided through [my Social Security](#) for easy online access by customers, including the Cost-of-Living Adjustment, their SSA-1099, Benefit Rate Increases, Appointment Confirmations, and more.

New [my Social Security](#) account holders can choose online-only communications with one click, and others are encouraged to transition for an enhanced experience.

Social Security is undertaking this work in alignment with the Executive Order on *Transforming Federal Customer Experience and Service Delivery to Rebuild Trust in Government* ([E.O. 14058](#)), the Office of Management and Budget’s (OMB) guidance *Delivering a Digital-First Public Experience* ([M-23-22](#)), and OMB guidance *Improving Access to Public Benefits Programs Through the Paperwork Reduction Act* (M-22-10).
