February is Black History Month

President Gerald Ford began the tradition of declaring February to be Black History Month in 1976.



Black History Carter Godwin Woodson founded The Journal of Negro History in 1916 and began Negro History Week (later Black History Month) in 1926, earning him the nickname "The Father of Black History."

The son of enslaved African Americans, Carter Woodson earned undergraduate degrees at Kentucky's Berea College in 1903 and at the University of Chicago in

1907. He also studied at the Sorbonne in Paris, and after he earned a graduate degree at Chicago (1908), he went on to earn his doctorate in History from Harvard University in 1912. He was the second African American to earn a Ph.D. at Harvard — the first was W.E.B. DuBois Woodson.

Carter Goodwin also taught in public schools in Washington, D.C. and served as a dean at both Howard University and the West Virginia Collegiate Institute.

But his greatest impact was as the leader of the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, an organization he founded in Chicago in 1915. (The name was changed to the Association for the Study of African American Life and History — ASALH — in 1972.)

Carter Woodson began Negro History Week in 1926, designating a week in February, because that month held birthdays for Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and Booker T. Washington. That went on to become Negro History Month and then Black History Month, designated as February each year by presidential proclamation.

Groundhog Day is on Sunday February 2nd, 2025.

This popular observance starts in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania where Punxsutawney Phil, the official groundhog lives. The day, it is believed, the groundhog comes out of his deep sleep and is comparable to the European tradition, Candlemas Day. The official groundhog is named Punxsutawaney Phil, who appears form his hideaway at Gobbler's Knole in Pennsylvania every



year.

Groundhog Day originated from German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania. They had a tradition of watching a badger predict when to plant

their crops. Since there were not many badgers in Pennsylvania, they used a groundhog. On February 2, if the groundhog sees his shadow it will run from it, predicting another 6 weeks of winter. If it does not see its shadow then <u>Spring</u> is closely coming

The first recorded celebration of Groundhog Day, then still known as Candlemas Day, was in the year 1841 in Morgantown, Pa. Punxsutawaney Phil is very popular and has met President Reagan in Washington.

Many visitors come to the festivities surrounding the groundhog's prediction.

February 3rd The Day the Music Died. On February 3, 1959, American <u>rock and roll</u> musicians <u>Buddy</u>

Holly, Ritchie Valens, and "The Big Bopper" J. P. Richardson were

killed in a plane crash near <u>Clear Lake</u>

After stopping at Clear Lake to perform, and frustrated by such conditions, Holly chose to charter a plane to reach their next venue in <u>Moorhead</u>, <u>Minnesota</u>. Richardson, suffering from flu, swapped places with Jennings, taking his seat on the plane, while Allsup lost



his seat to Valens on a <u>coin toss</u>. Soon after takeoff, late at night and in poor, wintry weather conditions, the pilot lost control of the light aircraft, a <u>Beechcraft Bonanza</u>, which subsequently crashed into a cornfield, killing all four on board.

The event has since been mentioned in several songs and films. Various monuments have been erected at the crash site and in Clear Lake, where an annual memorial concert is also held at the <u>Surf Ballroom</u>, the venue that hosted the artists' last performances.

February 3rd The Day the Music Died. On February 3, 1959, American <u>rock and</u> <u>roll</u> musicians <u>Buddy Holly</u>, <u>Ritchie Valens</u>, and <u>"The Big Bopper" J. P. Richardson</u> were killed in a plane crash near <u>Clear Lake</u>, <u>Iowa</u>, together with pilot Roger Peterson. The event later became known as "**The Day the Music Died**" after singer-songwriter <u>Don McLean</u> referred to it as such in his 1971 song "<u>American Pie</u>".
