# Introduction

After hosting the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP26) in November 2021, Glasgow has a unique opportunity to demonstrate that a genuinely sustainable legacy can be achieved from hosting the event. Sustainable Glasgow will be a principal means through which partners can contribute to Glasgow City based projects, positive messaging and the projection of good news stories over the years leading to the target of 2030. The City's key businesses and employers can and must show leadership in delivering real progress on the net-zero future of Glasgow.

The Sustainable Glasgow Green Economy Hub Charter is a commitment by leading businesses and employers in Scotland's largest city, and host of COP26, to take action within their own organisations and sectors to contribute to a green recovery and radically reduce the City's carbon emissions.

The Green Economy Hub is for those organisations who are committed to being leaders in the race to net zero and who are dedicated to delivering a sustainable and circular Glasgow together.

In 2020, Glasgow City Council's Climate Emergency Working Group made 61 recommendations ranging across all areas of city activity. Few of them can be delivered by the Council alone and they therefore set both a context and a significant challenge for a city-wide partnership. The climate emergency report sets, in effect, a new approach to an already familiar agenda for partners to consider and it is proposed that the City's response to its recommendations is led through Sustainable Glasgow.

Sustainable Glasgow will convene, catalyse and challenge organisations that commit to the Green Economy Hub Charter, recognising and celebrating not just what those organisations are doing now, but what they will do on the journey to net zero and a green recovery.

The Green Economy Hub Charter represents a step on the path to a 'new normal' of sustainable business practice in a thriving green city.

Sustainable Glasgow also recognises that the City is driven by a large population of small to medium enterprises (SMEs) who may require significant support to deliver against the commitments in this Charter. Those SMEs who sign up to the ambition of delivering this Charter may be able to access support through Scotland's sustainable business support ecosystem which includes Business Gateway, Scottish Enterprise, Zero Waste Scotland, the Energy Savings Trust and SEPA.

Effect significant and demonstrable change in our business practices resulting in an accelerated reduction in climate emissions that contribute to Glasgow's net-zero carbon target.

- Communicate our approach to tackling climate change and promote the importance of greater efforts to tackle climate change.
- Share learning with members of the Sustainable Glasgow Green Economy Hub and other city organisations looking to accelerate action on climate change.
- Roll out climate literacy for staff, including the management team as a minimum.
- Promote, support and enable employee choices and behaviours to contribute positively to a net-zero future.
- Maximise the impact of procurement across the value chain to accelerate emissions reductions with particular focus on capital investment decision making.

- Commit to a clear programme of deep retrofit of the organisational estate.
- Switch all energy use to sustainable energy sources and commit to purchasing heat/power from local district networks if available and viable for our organisation.
- Explore the potential of the organisational estate to generate renewable and sustainable energy and contribute to increased greenspace, biodiversity and sequestration.
- Prioritise locally sourced, seasonal, **sustainable food** for our employees and/or customers and integrate the **food waste hierarchy** into our organisation's operations and future business planning.




