2. Minutes of Previous Meeting and Actions

- 2.1 The minutes from the previous meeting were approved. Gavin Slater provided update on actions from the previous meeting.

3. Update on Website Development & SG Logo presentation

3.1 GS introduced Andrew Stevenson (AS) of Tangent to the board. AS presented a proposal of the website. AS advised they want to change the tone of the overall brand and the logo has been designed as a ticking clock, with each triangle representing the founding member of the board. The font used is a new font created by Tangent.

SA asked the board for their feedback and approval. GJ supports the website and logo and was grateful of the introduction as it showed how the logo would work as a clock. GS queried whether the number of triangles would change if the number of board members changes. AS advised, it would only represent the founding members, this would provide a legacy story.

GG asked whether the branding would need to be registered and suggested looking at the legal side re trademarking and how the logo can be used by others. RY queried whether the Net Zero target would be included in the web narrative, if stakeholders wish to know the long-term goal. GS suggested that AS create two versions of the website, until the terminology is clarified between Net Zero and Carbon Neutral.

SA noted the positive feedback and board approval.

4. Carbon Neutral Innovation District

4.1 RY provided to the board a presentation on the Feasibility Study into Climate Neutral Innovation District. The presentation shows the study has now moved into the technical and environmental assessment stage and has identified early interventions, mainly what actions can be taken, suggestions for the city, including incorporating High Street into the Avenues project and using the River Clyde as a heat source.

SP asked how connections would be enabled with residents and businesses. GJ advised that it would be a good presentation to take to Ofgem. RY stated he would have a discussion with Ofgem around what the best way is to enable to City to use its own energy. CC advised she would be keen to chat regarding the next stage of the project. TB advised that the University is fully supportive of the study and would encourage other organisations to sign up also and it would be useful to have a group of stakeholders to agree to take part.

5. Green Infrastructure and Transport Hub Update

5.1 TB advised that the hub held a workshop on 25th march with 27 delegates and are working on a report which will explore short, medium and long term interventions. Suggestions have included centralised drop boxes and the creation of a logistics hub. Ideas are being developed and the report will be restructured and circulated for feedback.

6. Private Sector and Green Recovery Hub Update

6.1 GJ advised that the hubs main initiative is the charter and a version is being prepared for the agreed signatories. The draft should be completed in the next few weeks. A virtual event is being organised for the website launch. GJ will be promoting the charter at the Business Resilience Council and it will be suggested that the signatories report twice a year. GJ stated that Edinburgh have a similar charter and that they will work together. GS advised GJ will raise the charter at the Scottish City

Alliance taking place on 28th April. GS also stated that the council had appointed a Green Economy Manager and that an introduction should take place.

7. Greening the City Hub Update Recommendation

7.1 SC advised that Wheatley Group, Glasgow Science Centre, HSCP and SPEN have now joined the hub. An action plan is being developed, focusing on Tiny Forests at 10 sites, all around the city. Scottish Government and Nature Scotland are looking to run a pilot project. SC advised the next steps would be to draft the action plan to be considered by the partnership board. SP queried if there would be scope for businesses to support Tiny Forests. SC advised that Linear Park is part of the regeneration programme. It was suggested that SC, CC and Jane Laiolo provide a presentation on this at the next board meeting. SC stated that Dalmarnock was a great example of the council working with Clyde Gateway.

8. Heating and Housing Hub Update

8.1 PF advised the board that the latest hub meeting focussed on Retro Fit, looking at the pre 1919 tenement strategy from Scottish Government. Paul Kilby also presented to the hub on energy efficiency housing retrofit work. The zero-emissions task force was discussed as well as the Heat in Buildings Strategy draft. PF advised this was very important in how targets will be met. PF advised the next hub meeting would focus on heat.

9. Climate Clock

9.1 GS provided a presentation of the Countdown clock which will feature on the Trongate Clock Tower. This will be launched at the beginning of May, 6 months before COP26. GS has fed back to the developers regarding the split words (Emergency, Renewables, Glasgow). SA stated it was good to see this part of Glasgow being used. GS requested a photo call with the board Chair and Chairs of each hub. The chairs agreed to this a proposal.
