

Answers to Questions 2020 Annual Meeting of Stockholders

With low prices for oil, what is being done to improve the efficiency of the process to get additional profit from each barrel of oil?

Marathon Oil has responded decisively to market conditions by reducing capital expenditures, managing cost structure and protecting our balance sheet and liquidity.

The Company's reduced capital budget is high-grading to our most capital efficient basins, Bakken and Eagle Ford and suspended Resource Play Exploration (REx), Oklahoma and Northern Delaware activity. Additionally, the 1Q 2020 U.S. unit production cost of \$4.63/boe was the lowest quarterly average for the company since becoming an independent E&P.

We expect to realize additional annualized cash cost savings of \$350 million relative to the initial 2020 budget across numerous expense categories, including production expense, general and administrative expense, shipping and handling expense and production taxes.

We entered this unprecedented downturn on firm financial footing, and we believe we are taking the necessary steps to protect our hard-earned financial strength and flexibility.

How many miles of pipeline does the Company have and what is the percentage utilization of those pipelines? Additionally, does the Company charge third parties to use the pipeline?

Marathon Oil owns and operates the Sugarloaf gathering system, a 42-mile natural gas pipeline through the heart of our Eagle Ford acreage in Karnes and Atascosa counties. These facilities are solely utilized by Marathon Oil operated volumes.
