Our group discussed important bills such as H.R. 4221 - Healthcare for Our Troops Act, H.R. 4220 - Dental Care for Our Troops Act, and H.R. 7543 - Guard and Reserve GI Bill Parity Act. These bills aim to provide better healthcare options, dental care, and educational assistance to our National Guard and Reserve members.

Overall, this experience was truly an honor and incredibly fulfilling. I am looking forward to attending more events like this in the future. Being able to actively shape the future of the Army and Air National Guard by addressing the challenges we face is something that is becoming a passion for me and I highly recommend to all serving members to be involved as well.
