

Introduction

The following document outlines the Data Protection Impact Assessment (DPIA) carried out by Celo Limited for the use of its collaboration software "Celo" by healthcare providers.

Purpose

A DPIA is a process to help identify and minimize the data protection risks of the collection or uses of potentially sensitive data and to allow an organization to make an informed decision about the technology used in data collection, use or sharing of information.

Scope

This DPIA relates specifically to the use of the Celo software platform by healthcare providers. This document will be continually updated and Celo Limited reserves the right to update the DPIA as necessary at any time, particularly in regard to any changing data protection law.

Background

It should be noted that it is a requirement to complete a DPIA when there is any significant change made to the way in which data is collected or processed by an organization. This ensures that the impact of any changes in regards to the data subject and that their rights have been fully considered.

The ICO provides the following guidance for completing a DPIA:

- 1. Identify the need for a DPIA.
- 2. Describe the processing/information flow.
- 3. Consultation process.
- 4. Assess necessity and proportionality.
- 5. Identify and assess risks.
- 6. Identify measures to reduce risks.
- 7. Sign off and record outcomes.
