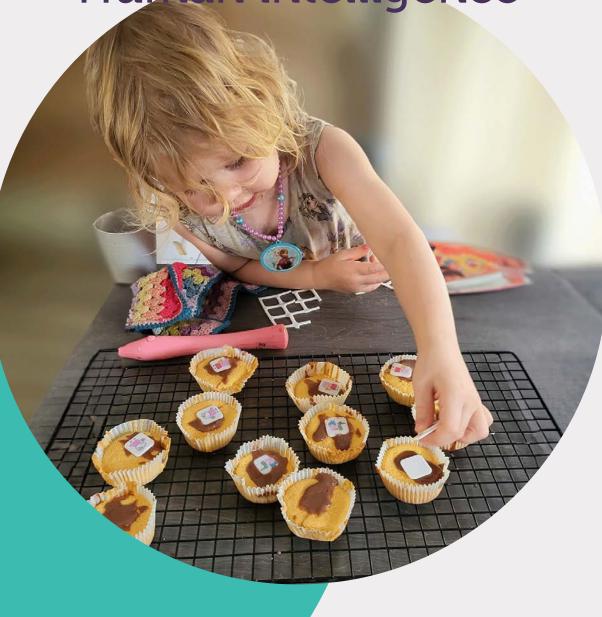
A risk writers use AI to respond to answers and create text responses that don't strategically answer the questions.



Steve Mullins The Proposal Symposium The job of the proposal is to make it overwhelmingly inevitable that I should choose you.

Al doesn't capture the same insight in the same way having a real relationship with the client does.

Better than some text of many writers – but certainly much worse than the text of good bid writers who can produce compelling customer-specific bid text.



Content edited for readability, flow and word count

Raw material collated from credible sources to answer questions Weave in strategic messaging and differentiation, aligning to client hot buttons and scoring

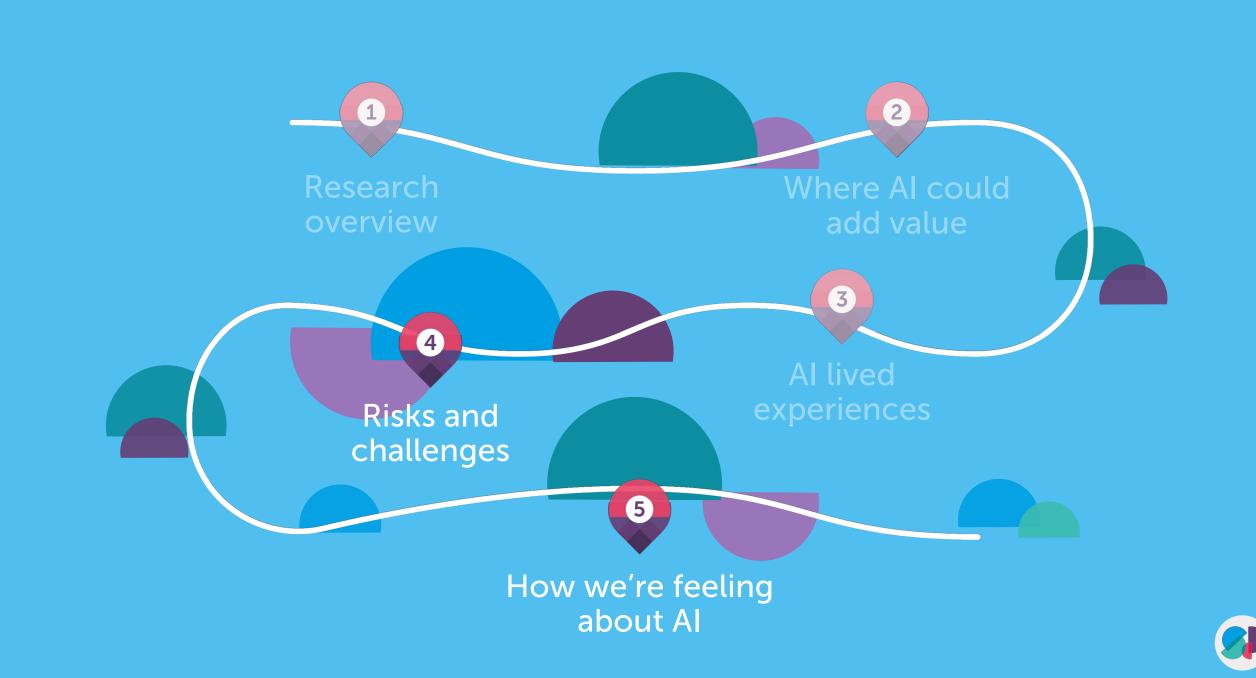

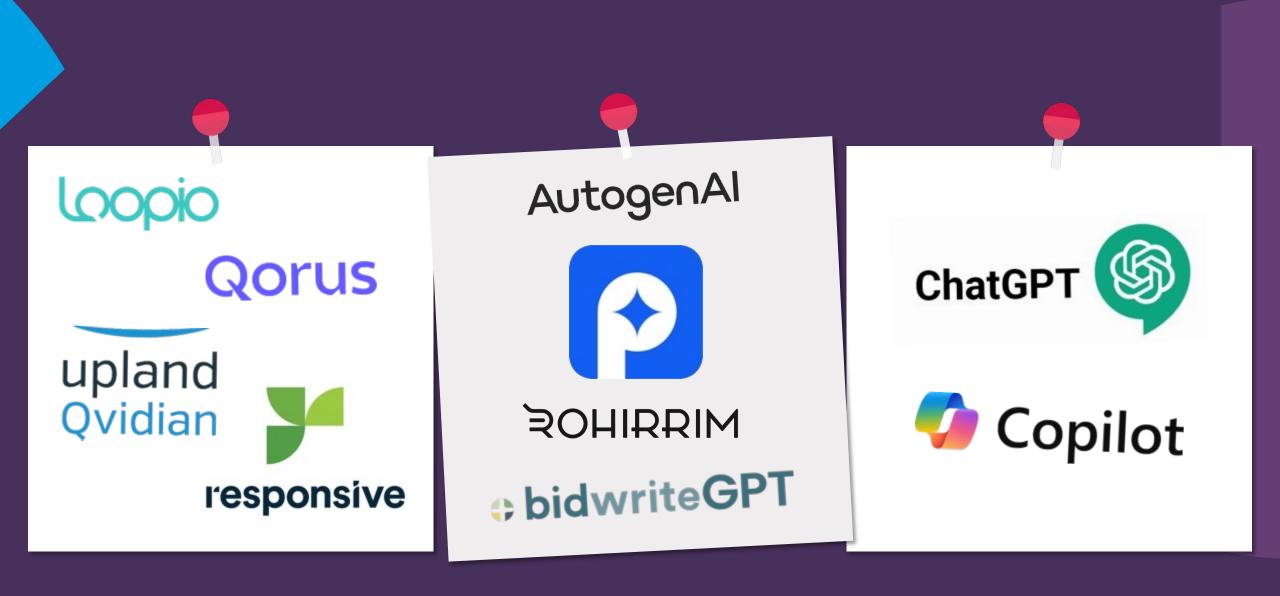

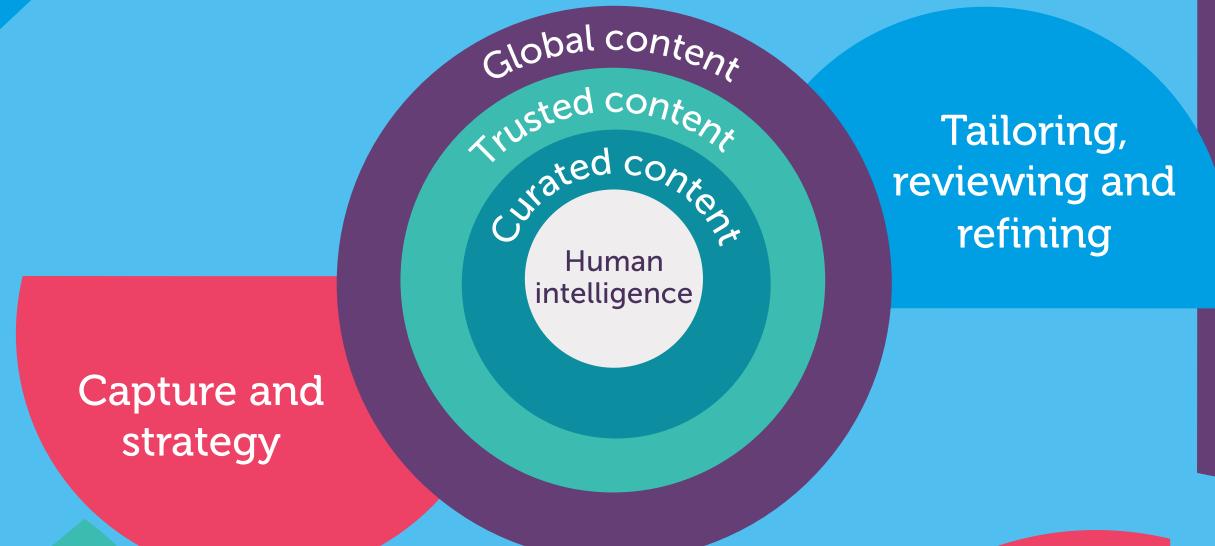
