Introduction

The Nordic Pavilion's participation in EXPO 2025 Osaka Kansai marks our third appearance at EXPO, with both previous events also held in Japan, in Osaka and Aichi. Despite being neighbouring countries with different cultures, languages, and customs, the five Nordic nations, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden, come together to showcase our shared ideas and technologies in the fields of technology, innovation, and sustainability at the Osaka EXPO. Pavilion Overview

Designed by Italian architect Michele De Lucchi and AMDL Circle, and build by RIMOND, the pavilion will be a **1 200-square-metre**, **17-metre tall timber structure** that evokes timelessness and sustainable thinking. It will house a Nordic exhibition area as well as a rooftop with a restaurant and a Nordic garden, in addition to other meeting spaces and a business centre. The joint pavilion at Expo 2025 in Osaka is an opportunity for the world to join in on the Nordic model of trust, sustainability and innovation.



* The timber used for the pavilion's construction will be sourced locally in Japan and repurposed after the Expo.

* The pavilion itself reflects these principles, designed to keep out rain while allowing natural breezes, minimizing the need for air conditioning.





Pavilion overview

The Nordic Pavilion embodies timeless and sustainable values through its timber structure, featuring a distinctly Nordic wooden design and recyclable materials. Inspired by the shape of a traditional Nordic barn, its design reflects simplicity and functional beauty, hallmarks of Nordic style.

The pavilion includes an exhibition area, a shop, a rooftop café, meeting rooms, and event spaces, all collaboratively developed by the five Nordic countries. Its minimalist design avoids unnecessary ornamentation, emphasizing harmony with nature and innovative ventilation.

Sustainability is at the core of its architecture, with a design that keeps out rain while allowing natural breezes, minimizing reliance on air-conditioning. The pavilion has become an iconic representation of Nordic design philosophy.

■ A Nordic experience with just a smartphone during waiting times

Visitors can enjoy a Nordic adventure using their smartphones as a prelude while waiting to explore the Nordic Pavilion. By scanning a designated QR code, a dynamic video appears, swirling around the pavilion. Users are taken on a virtual flight above the Nordic countries, and by moving their smartphone, they can "land" at various locations showcasing each country's unique features, such as Iceland's carbon capture facility or a stunning bicycle bridge over Copenhagen's harbor.

■ 'Food trucks' with Nordic flavors welcome guests

In front of the Nordic Pavilion, an ice cream stand will greet visitors. On select event days, additional food stands offering hot dogs and other Nordic specialties will also welcome guests.

The restaurant and shop in the pavilion are inspired by the 'Nordic Circle', a two-part concept.


■ Nordic Shop

■ Nordic Food Bar

Led by Frida Longe, Nordic Food Bar offers a special culinary experience that incorporates Nordic flavours with Japanese elements. With a fresh and creative approach, guests can enjoy the unique flavours of Nordic cuisine. Furthermore, the restaurant aims to contribute to a recycling-oriented society with its vision of 'zero food waste'. It provides inspiration and pleasure to visitors through its sustainable dining experiences.





Pavilion overview | Experience


■ Immersive exhibition that allows visitors to experience Scandinavia through all five senses.

In Whirl, white, translucent, renewable materials are suspended in the air like a whirlpool.

These rice papers, which reach a height of more than 6 metres, project dynamic images of the daily lives of Scandinavian people. The immersive exhibition also features room temperatures and scents that recreate Scandinavia, allowing visitors to experience Scandinavia through all five senses.

Landscape *Tentative name

The three black rock-like formations lined up in a row are graphic panels that react to sensors when a person approaches and a video is played. Each is divided into three themes - 'Lifestyle & Wellbeing', 'Mobility & Connectivity' and 'Green Transition & Circular Economy' - with content that answers the themes explored in the vortex. Fascinating facts about the Nordic region are presented in a fun and accessible way for all ages.


