

Lesson Plan: Day Review**35 minutes****Learning Expectations**

At the end of this session participants will be able to:

1. Review and assess the workshop's lesson plans
2. Review their original learning expectations
3. Complete the participant final evaluation

Materials

- Flip chart
- Markers
- Masking tape

Preparation

- ◆ Read and prepare lesson plan
- ◆ Write learning outcomes on the flip chart
- ◆ Prepare flip chart with one lesson plan topic on each.
- ◆ Print final evaluations (1 per participant)

Introduction**10 minutes**

1. Inform participants that they are going for day 1 review.
2. Also inform participants that they are going for group work. For this, participants will be divided into 5 groups.
3. Each group will be provided a topic and in the topic the group has to discuss and draw a concept map.
4. Describe concept map as: *A concept map is a diagram used to show relationships between different concepts and ideas. It is a tool used in many professions to organize knowledge. Typically, information is represented by words in circles, and lines connecting related concepts. Concepts can also be linked by other words, drawings, images, symbols, etc.*
5. Present an example of a concept map (See end of lesson plan) or draw the beginning of one on the board or flip chart. After checking that participants understand what a concept map is, continue to the next step.
6. Distribute the five flip charts to the groups. One flip chart for each group.
7. Provide a topic to each group and ask the participants to write the key messages or information that they have learned from that lesson plan's activities on the flip chart paper.

Topics: Concepts and importance of total sanitation, Components of total sanitation, Water quality, Point of Use options, Importance and safe use of latrine

8. Ask each group to present their responses to the large group by having all of the participants come to the corner of the room where that group's flip chart is located.
9. Summarize their main ideas and add anything missing.

Note: A full concept map will include much more detail and types of connections than this sample.
