### Federal Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 ends September 30, 2025.

### House:

 12/12 appropriations bills passed out of Committee, and 3/12 passed a floor vote.

### Senate:

 9/12 appropriations bills passed out of Committee, and 3/12 passed a floor vote.

Federal budget enacted on time 3 times in the last 47 years ('89, '95, and '97).

### **Continuing Resolution:**

 Provides funding, generally, at prior year amounts for an amount of time.

#### **Government Shutdown:**

 Just before dapse in appropriation, agencies develop contingency plans for essential functions and personnel.

### Let's talk about the mechanics of federal spending:

When Congress enactappropriations laws , it provides budget authority , or the power to enter into legally binding obligations .

### Budget authority is provided:

- For a purpose,
- In anamount ,
- With a time period of use, and
- Made available for duration of time.

For expenses necessary for the operation of Indian programs, as authorized by law, including the Snyder Act of November 2, 1921 (25 U.S.C. 13) and the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act of 1975 (25 U.S.C. 5301 et seq.), \$1,898,550,000, to remain available until September 30, 2025, except as otherwise provided herein; of which not to exceed \$15,000 may be for official recention and representation expenses; of which

### Let's talk about the mechanics of federal spending:

The United States has a series of laws known as Athtedeficiency Laws or Act, even though it has been revised and refers to provisions throughout Title 31 of the U.S. Code.

### In 1870, Antideficiency laws developed around an appropriations provision stating:

"[t]hat it shall not be lawful for any department of the government be expend in any one fiscal year, or to involve the government in any contract for the future payment of money in excess of such appropriations."

### Let's talk about the mechanics of federal spending:

Even with the Antideficiency Laws, the Executive branch deems certain government functions and personnel essential as part of a process know Contingency Planning.

### What's a rule on spending without a nice big exception?

Among several exceptions, employees whose duties involved fety of human life or the protection of property may be told by an agency to come to work during the period in which funds are lapsed or unavailable.

### Programs are impacted by a shutdown differently, depending on how they are funded by Congress.

### **Discretionary Appropriations:**

- Most discretionary programs would experience a lapse in appropriations.
- Advance appropriations, forward funded, advance funded accounts would not be immediately and directly disrupted.

### **Mandatory Appropriations:**

- Direct appropriations would not be immediately and directly disrupted.
- Expiring direct appropriations and appropriated entitlements could be disrupted.

## "Immediately?" "Directly?" "Could be disrupted??" Be more specific.

- With the exception of IHSmost tribal programs would be severely impacted by a government shutdown
- Even with funding mechanisms that keep programs operating taffeadministering
   those programs may not be deemed essential under an agency's contingency plan.
- The IHS has six accounts not funded by advance appropriations. The agency will use
  prior year balances to keep all staff on, instead of experiencing a partial shutdown.
  However, Contract Support Costs and Section 105(I) lease payments are not
  included. No payments are expected for these accounts, and prolonged shutdown
  could put further economic hardship onto Tribes and Tribal Organizations.

# On Wednesday, September 24, 2025, OMB shutdown guidance was broadly shared with the press.

- Agency lapse plans (aka, contingency plans)
- Reduction in Force (RIF) notices

Thank you for your agency's efforts to date to prepare for an orderly shutdown in the event of a lapse in appropriations. As required by Section 124 of OMB Circular A-11, OMB held its first lapse planning call with agencies earlier this week, and we will continue to provide lapse updates as we approach the end of the fiscal year.

Over the past 10 fiscal years, Congress has consistently passed Continuing Resolutions (CRs) on or by September 30 on a biparisia andsis Unfortunately Congressional Democratis are signaling that they intend to break this bipartisan trend and shut down the government in the coming days over a series of insane demands, including \$1 tillion in mey spending. Last week, the House of Representatives passed H.R. 5371, a clean CR that would fund the

government at current levels through November 21. The Administration supports Senate passage of H.R. 5371, but congressional Democrats are currently blocking this clean CR due to their partitian demands.

As such, it has never been more innocrant for the Administration to be removed for a shutdown.

As such, it has never oven more important for the Administration to be prepared for a shudowing if the Democratis choose to pursue one. Thankfully, H.R. I, provided ample resources to ensure that many core Trump Administration priorities will continue uninterrupted.

Programs that did not benefit from an infusion of mandatory appropriations will bear the brunt of a shutdown, and we must continue our planning efforts in the event Democrats decide to shut down the government. If Congress successfully passes a cleam CR prior to September 30, the additional steps outlined in this email will not be necessary.

With respect to those Federal programs whose funding would lapse and which are otherwise infinitedously programs are no longer submortly required to be certified. ### On Wednesday, September 24, 2025, OMB agency contingency plan guidance was broadly leaked to the press.

- "Agency lapse plans" (aka, contingency plans) are due to OMB as soon as possible.
- Agency plans should not "repurpose" balances or assume use of transfer authorities.
   Any exceptions must be requested of OMB, and will be considered on aboase basis.
- Even if agencies had already submitted their plan, OMB may reach out in the coming days to require plan updates.

### On Wednesday, September 24, 2025, OMB agency contingency plan guidance was broadly leaked to the press.

• "... [A]gencies are directed to use this opportunity to consider Reduction in Force (RIF) notices for all employees in programs, projects, or activities (PPAs) that satisfy all three of the following conditions(1) discretionary funding lapses on October 1, 20(25); another source of funding, such as H.R. 1 (Public Law211)9s not currently available; and(3) the PPA is not consistent with the President's priorities."



### **Agency Contingency Planning status update:**

- On Friday, September 26, 2025, federal sub agencies were submittind street essential personnel to cabinet -level leadership by COB.
- As of Friday, agencies wenet issuing directives for the Reduction in Force
   (RIF) portion of the OMB shutdown guidance. Agencies already conducting RIFs
   would continue the process and may be notified by OMB for additional changes during
   a shutdown.
- However, some federal management belietveould be a "phase II" action taken based on who was determined essential leading up to the shutdown. Even budget and managemenstaff feel less informed than past shutdown planning .

- Contact OMB, immediately . Demand that tribal program staffrotected from any RIFs. The window on determinations for essential workforce during a shutdown is closing, butabinet -level and White House contacts may still have influence .
