

At the heart of the gravel trails is the Highland Perthshire Drovers Trail, a circular multi-day bikepacking route which offers an enjoyable off-road journey steeped in history through a wide variety of Scottish landscapes, small market towns and villages.

The route features the remote and scenic glens in the Cairngorms National Park, the Tay, Scotland's longest river, Scotland's smallest and oldest distillery, the last surviving oak tree from the wood that inspired Shakespeare's Macbeth, waterfalls that heartened Robert Burns, Wade's Military Roads, drove roads and some of the best gravel paths that the Highlands have to offer.
