The Academic Skills Center (ASC) promotes academic, cognitive, and personal growth in all students and is a resource for the adult members of the School community as well. The ASC operates on a fee-free model, so that all students have access to the services the Center provides. The Director of the Academic Skills Center is a collaborative, mission-aligned educator, who works with the Dean of Academics and Faculty to develop and implement the ASC's innovative program. The Director participates in the development of the School's academic curriculum and works in partnership with other MHS educators to provide individualized academic support and meet the needs of all students. The ASC Department is committed to diversifying its staff.

- Provide individualized academic support and coaching for MHS students through the ASC
- Oversee and support the work of individual Learning Specialists
- Collaborate with administration, faculty, and families to support the needs of students with learning differences
- Design individual learning plans and create schedules for students in need of academic support to meet with Learning Specialists
- Act as a resource and provide professional development for adult community members in the areas of learning differences, executive function, and cognitive skill-building to implement best practices in teaching and learning
- Provide written progress reports to families at the end of each semester and as needed throughout the school year
- Maintain complete records for each student on the ASC roster and make relevant information regarding student learning profiles and accommodations available to faculty and staff
- Assist Admissions in the selection of prospective students who can fully participate in the academic and student life programs of the School
- In the role of Services for Students with Disabilities Coordinator, apply to the College Board for accommodations for eligible students
- As a member of the Health and Retention Committee, identify students of concern and coordinate psycho-educational evaluations as needed



- As a member of the Academic Affairs Committee, participate in curriculum development and oversight
- Partner with the Dean of Academics and Faculty to hire, develop, and retain mission-aligned faculty for the ASC
- Oversee administrative functions of the department, including managing the departmental budget
- Track trends in the educational field related to learning profiles and attend appropriate professional development opportunities
- Maintain an active presence and participate fully in campus life by attending school events, serving on committees, and participating in recreational activities when possible
- Serve weekend duty rotations as required of all educational administrators
- Participate in interdisciplinary and innovative curricular design and partnership
- Possess a demonstrated interest in, commitment to, and ability to work with students of varied academic levels and interests
- Demonstrate the ability to integrate classroom technologies to enhance teaching and learning
- Possess a demonstrated commitment to equity and inclusion and to serving a diverse, global community
- Display commitment to the Miss Hall's School Mission and Core Values
